

To the River

A Recap of "Borderlands & River Crossers"

On Friday, May 8th the Amherstburg Freedom Museum was lucky enough to host a presentation from PhD Candidate and Fulbright Canada Researcher, Maria Esther Hammack, live on our Facebook page. She presented "Borderlands & River Crossers: Re-Examining Freedom & Safe Havens in Upper Canada" which included a discussion of slavery and its abolition in Upper Canada and comparisons to Mexico. Maria also shared narratives of Freedom Seekers to show how some found freedom in Cana-



da, while others sadly did not. These narratives include a woman named Charlotte who crossed the Detroit River and arrived in Amherstburg in the Winter of 1840 and a man named Nelson Hackett who arrived in 1841, but was tragically returned to the United States.


