A Tribute to Paul Hertel

The Amherstburg Freedom Museum expresses very sincere condolences to Ute and the Hertel family on the passing of Paul Hertel on August 29, 2020. Paul was a founding member of the Museum and was a long-time supporter. He was born in Kitchener, Ontario and grew up in Hespeler, Ontario. He graduated from Preston High School, Waterloo Lutheran University and Althouse College and University of Western Ontario.



Before retirement, Paul was a history and social sciences teacher and department head at General Amherst High School and Sandwich South Secondary



School for thirty-two years. Paul also served on Amherstburg Town Council in 1978 and as Deputy Reeve in 1980. He also Paul served three terms on council and was committed to urban renewal, sustainable development and local historical preservation, including the development the King's Navy Yard Park along the Amherstburg waterfront.

In addition to his involvement with the Amherstburg Freedom Museum,

Paul also played a role in several other groups including The Amherstburg Per-

forming Arts Society, The Gibson House Gallery and Art In The Park, Amherstburg Family Health Team, Essex County Citizens Against Fermi II and the Bellevue Conservancy. For his efforts, Paul was awarded the Mike Walsh Award in 2003 and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Award in 2013.

We will long remember his friendship, support and valuable advice during his many years with the Museum. We trust that Ute will continue to find comfort in our appreciation of her support for him which helped make it possible. We share in her sense of loss and value all that he gave.
