Question to Paikea: What are your hobbies or extra-curricular activities?

Answer: I like to go on bike rides and hang out with friends. I am on the soccer team at school. I also volunteer coach with Windsor Minor Hockey. It's fun to watch other players get better. Hockey was the sport that I played growing up. I played for the Windsor Wildcats.

Question to Paikea: What was it like being a Black girl playing hockey?

Answer: It was definitely challenging at times. The sport never really loved me back. I played forward. There were team members and players that would try to put me down and being the only Black girl of my age group in Essex County it was hard for me to find a safe space in the sport. I started playing at age of 5 years and kept playing because it was something I really loved to do outside of school. I really enjoyed play-

ing with friends.

Question to Paikea: What advice do you have for

young girls who want to play hockey?

Answer: No matter how hard someone tries to knock you down over the sport you love, keep your head up. The ideology of talent and success based on skin color is still in people's mind set. But don't let that get to you, push through the negative.

Question to Paikea: Tell me about your fondest


memory on the ice rink.

Answer: Meeting Hayley Wickenheiser (former Cap-

Canadian Women's Olympic team) at the Olympic Center in

Calgary. She was hosting an annual hockey tournament. During the tournament, I was awarded one of the game MVPs. Although my team lost that game, just meeting her and receiving the MVP award was awesome.

Question to Thandiwe: What are your hobbies or extra-curricular activities?

Answer: I enjoy talking with my friends, and going on social media to see what's new. At school, I play on the soccer team and run track (1500m, 800m, & 3000m). Outside of school, I play with the Tecumseh soccer club.

Question to Thandiwe: What's it like being a Black girl playing soccer?

Answer: Pretty awesome! I'm proud to be "one of the only's" on the field. I have the ability and skill. I view it as my time to shine. I also enjoy having fun with my teammates. We work hard and it shows in the games that we play.



Question to Paikea: What do you plan to study in University? Why?

Answer: Biochemistry and then do a post grad for Nurse Practitioner. I'm really into the sciences and I like to talk to people and get to know them so this seems like a good fit.

Thandiwe was recently selected to join the Ontario Excel Provincial soccer team.

Thandiwe Question: What happens next now that you've been selected to play for the provincial soccer team?

Answer: I'll travel to Toronto for practice with other players from across the province. After a couple practices, we play a game against the Quebec provincial team.

Question to Thandiwe: What's your favorite subject in school? Do you know what you want to do when you grow up?


Eligible students can be awarded up to \$1,500. The submission deadline is *Thursday, June 30, 2022.*
