Beyond the Underground Railroad Exhibit Opening



On Thursday, August 31st, the Amherstburg Freedom Museum hosted the exhibit opening for Beyond the Underground Railroad: A History of Black Settlement in 19th Century Amherstburg which was created by University of Windsor student Karleigh Kochaniec. This exhibit is

part of the Local Black History Internship Program which was created in partnership between the Amherstburg Freedom

Museum and the University of Windsor's History Department. The Internship is also generously funded by the Board of Amherstburg Freedom Museum and a Mitacs Accelerate Program Grant.



During Karleigh's presentation, she talked about her exhibit



and shared her experience in creating both the in-person exhibit and digital map, which maps Black settlement in Essex County and shares the stories of those connected to the listed properties. Beyond the Underground Railroad: A History of Black Settlement in 19th Century Am-

The Mac Simpson Award was created to honour the legacy of Museum founder, Melvin 'Mac' Simpson and the Maturine-Romain Award is given on behalf of Dr. Bernice McKenzie to honour the lives and memory of her grandmothers, Evelina Maturine

Jordyn Taylor was awarded both a Mac Simpson Award and a Maturine-Romain Scholarship. She attended Kingsville District High School and is currently enrolled in the Advertising and Marketing Communication Management Program at St. Clair College. Jordyn's extracurricular activities include karate, swimming, dance and long distance running. She was also on the Honour Roll.



Reese Akpata is the winner of a Mac Simpson Award. Reese attended Sandwich Secondary High School and is studying Criminology and Law at Wilfred Laurier University/ Sussex University. 


