*** The Maturine-Romain Award ***

A prize of up to \$2000 may be awarded annually by The Amherstburg Freedom Museum

PURPOSE

- To honour the memory and lives of Evelina Maturine and Lucie Romain, the grandmothers of Dr. Bernice McKenzie. Evelina and Lucie grew up on the small island of Carriacou, part of Grenada in the West Indies. Neither of them were allowed to pursue education past an elementary school level. Two generations later, their progeny includes teachers, lawyers, social workers, engineers and doctors.
- To promote the valuable role of *the Amherstburg Freedom Museum* in the community.
- To support and encourage students as they pursue post-secondary studies.

ELIGIBILITY

This award will be given annually to at least one student of African descent who is currently attending a secondary school in the Essex County area and will be commencing post-secondary studies in September 2022 on a full-time basis. Students will be required to provide proof of attendance.

Applicants are required to submit:

- a completed application form
- two letters of reference supporting school and community involvement
- transcript of academic record
- proof of post-secondary registration and offer of acceptance (due in September)
- completed essay, poster, or multi-media presentation

SELECTION

- Each secondary school in Essex County is encouraged to facilitate the application and recommend nominees.
- A selection committee will review all applications. The successful applicant(s) will receive the award(s).
- This award will be given to any student only once and is not renewable.
- The selection committee reserves the right to withhold the award in any given year due to lack of suitable application quality or for non-compliance with any of the rules.
- Decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- Award recipient(s) will be notified by August 15, 2022
