Description: The Backbridge Commitment is a Black history/cultural resource. It is a 400-page sociopolitical novel whose focus is primarily on migration from the Caribbean (Trinidad and Tobago) to North America (Canada) but also addresses the issues of slavery, colonialism and indentureship. 
