Mac Simpson Award

A prize of up to \$1500 may be awarded annually by The Amherstburg Freedom Museum

Submission deadline is Friday June 28th, 2024

PURPOSE

- To honour the memory of Melvin "Mac" Simpson, the founder of *the Amherstburg Freedom Museum* and to recognize his dedication to education and commitment to the community.
- To promote the valuable role of the Amherstburg Freedom Museum in the community.
- To support and encourage students as they pursue post-secondary studies.

ELIGIBILITY

This award will be given annually to at least one student of African descent who is currently attending a secondary school in the Essex County area and will be commencing post-secondary studies in September 2024 on a full-time basis. Students will be required to provide proof of attendance.

Applicants are required to submit:

- a completed application form (see attached)
- two letters of reference supporting school and community involvement
- transcript of academic record
- proof of post-secondary registration and offer of acceptance (due in September)
- completed essay, poster, or multi-media presentation

SELECTION

Each secondary school in Essex County is encouraged to facilitate the application and recommend nominees.

- A selection committee appointed by the Museum's Board of Directors will review all applications. The successful applicant(s) will receive the award(s).
- This award will be given to any student only once, and is not renewable.
- The selection committee reserves the right to withhold the award in any given year due to lack of suitable application quality or for non-compliance with any of the rules.
- Decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- Award recipient(s) will be notified by August 2024

PRESENTATION

The successful recipient(s) will be notified by August 2024, with awards presented in September as part The successful recipient(s) will receive the award during the fall semester upon providing proof of admission.

The selection committee will evaluate the submissions on the basis of their potential to have a positive impact on the educational aspirations of African Canadian youth and on the positive development of society in general. Submissions will be judged on the content, clarity, and coherence of the topic as it is expressed throughout the work.

**Essays must include a title page which lists the title of the essay, school of attendance, and the student's contact information including address and telephone number. Essays must be typed, double-spaced, and free of grammatical and syntax errors.

Option 1: Black History Maker of Tomorrow

 Write an essay containing between 1000 - 1500 words on how and why you plan to make a positive impact on Black history and in the community.

Option 2: Illuminating the Past

 Develop a poster which reflects significant individuals, locations and/or events in African Canadian history. Posters may be in colour or black and white. The poster must be accompanied by a brief description of the significance of each image on the poster.

Option 3: Media Presentation (e.g., POWERPOINT, MOVIEMAKER)

 Create a three to five-minute video or slideshow about (a) significant individual(s), location(s) and/or event(s) in African Canadian history. Descriptions must accompany all images used.

Option 4: What does Black history in Canada mean to me?

 Write an essay containing between 1000 - 1500 words describing what Black history in Canada means to you.

Option 5: Sharing our stories

 Conduct an oral history interview with a relative/relatives resulting in a record of roughly 1000 – 1500 words. Submission must be a transcript of the interview (the questions asked, and the answers provided). Topics can include family ancestors, your relative's childhood and/or career, how Essex County has changed over the years, how being a Black Canadian in Essex County has changed over the years, etc. ** All submissions become the property of the Amherstburg Freedom Museum.

Make sure all required items accompany this application:

- Completed application form
- Two letters of reference supporting school and community involvement
- Transcript of your academic record
- Proof of post-secondary registration and acceptance
- Completed essay, poster or multi-media presentation
