Museum Fundraiser: Canada's Renowned Nathaniel Dett Chorale to Perform May 3rd in Windsor





Nathaniel Dett Chorale May 3rd Concert, "Shout for Joy," to Feature Works by Multiple Black Composers

The Amherstburg Freedom Museum will present a concert by the celebrated Nathaniel Dett Chorale at All Saints' Anglican Church Windsor, May 3rd at 7:30 pm. The Nathaniel Dett Chorale is Canada's premier choral group dedicated to Afrocentric music of all styles, including classical, spiritual, gospel, jazz, folk and blues. You won't want to miss this performance. Tickets are on sale now at amherstburgfreedom.org.

The May 3rd concert will feature works by J. Rosamond Johnson and James Weldon Johnson, Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, Moses Hogan, Undine Smith Moore, Adolphus Hailstock, and R. Nathaniel Dett himself.

The Nathaniel Dett Chorale is Canada's first professional choral group dedicated to the creation, performance, and preservation of Afrocentric choral music. The multi-faceted vocalists of The Nathaniel Dett Chorale perform all styles and genres of music appropriate to the traditions of Africa and its Diasporas. The Chorale's mission is to build bridges of understanding, appreciation, and acceptance between communities of people through the medium of Afrocentric choral music.



Who was Nathaniel Dett? He was born October 11th, 1882 in Drummondville (now Niagara Falls), Ontario to parents who had been freedom seekers. In 1901, Dett began studying piano with Oliver Willis Halstead and three years later he was accepted to Oberlin Conservatory, where he majored in piano and composition. He also studied at Harvard University and in 1932 he graduated with a Master of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. Dett published roughly 100 compositions, mainly piano, vocal, and choral work. Among his most popular compositions are Listen to the Lambs (1914), Somebody's Knocking at Your Door (1919) and I'm So Glad Trouble Don't Last Always (1919). Alongside his other talents, Dett was a choir leader and teacher, an avid essayist, and a poet. His 1911 Album of a Heart contained 30 poems on topics such as love, nature, and music.

Founder D. Brainerd Blyden-Taylor named The Nathaniel Dett Chorale after internationally renowned African Canadian composer R. Nathaniel Dett (1882-1943) to draw attention to Dett's legacy, to the breadth of

Afrocentric choral music, and to be a professional choral ensemble where persons of African heritage can be well represented. Currently in its 26th Season, The Nathaniel Dett Chorale is also Artist in Residence at

The Harriet Tubman Institute for Research on Africa and its Diasporas at York University.

The Nathaniel Dett Chorale has gained global renown, particularly after being the only Canadian ensemble invited to participate in events surrounding President Obama's 2009 Inauguration in Washington, DC.

Tickets to the May 3rd concert, a fundraiser for the Museum, are \$40 per adult or \$30 per student. Tickets may be purchased at amherstburgfreedom.org or at the door.






Amherstburg Freedom Museum Celebrates Fifty Years of Black History and Universal Inspiration



2025 is the Museum's 50th anniversary, and we are looking forward to celebrating with all of you! In 1975, founder Melvin "Mac" Simpson, with the support of his wife Betty, founded the North American Black Historical Museum, now known as the Amherstburg Freedom Museum.

What began as a modest volunteer-run museum temporarily housed in the Nazrey African Methodist Episcopal Church hall, highlighting the history of the Black community in and near Amherstburg, now shares Black history and



universal inspiration with people from across Turtle Island and the world.

In the first four months of 2025 alone, the museum was visited by many Essex County residents of all ages but also individuals, families, and tour groups from across Ontario and Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, New York, Massachusetts, Florida, Colorado, New Zealand, and Spain.

Fiftieth anniversary celebrations began in earnest in February with the acclaimed original play *The Price of Freedom*, written by Carlos Anthony and produced by Arts Collective Theatre in collaboration with the Amherstburg Freedom Museum. The play based on the true story of freedom seeker John Anderson was a hit with audiences, including a special matinee performance for over 500 students from local schools.

The fiftieth anniversary celebration continues with a concert by the Nathaniel Dett Chorale on May 3rd. Ribs & Ragtime on June 14th will have special meaning this year as we celebrate our fiftieth anniversary as well as the fiftieth anniversary of the passing of Amherstburg's own Shelton Brooks (1886-1975) by whom the annual Ribs & Ragtime event has always been inspired. (Ragtime: get it?)


The Walter Perry Emancipation Golf Classic on August 9th at Coachwood



Jane's Walk Festival Draws Crowds to "Sold Out" Black History Walking Tours





On Saturday, April 26th, the Museum hosted not one but two sold out walking tours as part of the 2025 Jane's Walk Windsor/Essex Festival with Mary-Katherine Whelan and Irene Moore Davis as tour guides.

The 2025 Jane's Walk Festival for Windsor-Essex boasted a schedule of 55 events, making it the second largest Jane's Walk Festival in all of Canada. Jane's Walks (guided walking tours) and Jane's Talks (seated presentations) are free to attend and hosted by volunteers, but for the first time this year, advance registration is required as capacity is limited. Both of the Amherstburg Freedom Museum walking tours, "Beyond the River: The Underground Railroad and Black Community in Amherstburg" and "It Happened in Amherstburg: Black History in Amherstburg", reached capacity well over a week in advance.
